

Grades for teachers

Some students love them, others hate them - grades! Now there is a trend that students turn it all around - they grade their teachers! In Germany there have already been some conflicts, because students gave their teachers grades on the internet and everybody could see it. Of course, some teachers weren't amused and even engaged a lawyer to prevent that. *There are positive and negative aspects of grading teachers online.*

To begin with, grading teachers is only fair because teachers give grades to their students all the time. Students feel the pressure to be good every day and have to work hard to be successful at school while teachers are in a position where they don't have to be afraid of a bad grade. So, why not do it the other way around? It could also be useful for the teachers to know what the students think about them, which makes this a good idea.

Second, teachers will try harder to get better grades and lessons might become better. If teachers know that their work is assessed, they will prepare their lessons better and will try to include more interesting elements which encourage students to learn more at school. This would be a positive result of grading teachers.

However, you could also say that students do not know enough about teachers' work. They see teachers work in the classroom, but what do students know about teachers' lesson planning? Being a teacher is much more than just standing in the classroom, as you also have to do a lot of correction and organizing. And these are things that students cannot evaluate. Therefor giving grades to teachers might not be the right thing to do.

Moreover, it is likely that students will not give good grades to strict teachers but rather to teachers who are friendly towards students. But a friendly teacher is not necessarily a good teacher, as the most important aspect of being a teacher is to teach students important things for their future. Some students prefer a strict but competent teacher to a friendly but incompetent teacher. <u>Assessing teachers could maybe paint a too negative picture of the teacher</u>.

Finally, the atmosphere at school could become less friendly as the teachers always think that they are controlled by their students. School is more than grading and also is about having experiences together, for example on a students' exchange, on trips or at social events. It wouldn't be the same if teachers felt observed all the time, which puts this idea into question.

To summarize, I think that grading teachers is not a good idea, as there are too many disadvantages. However, I think it is good if students tell their teacher in class if they don't like something about his or her way of teaching. This could be helpful feedback for the teacher and improve his or her work. But I don't think we need grades for that.
